HB 4175 by Rep. Cody Harris requires that if a city denies an owner of a property outside the city limits of their rights to conduct an activity or build a structure on their land, the city must deliver city services to that ETJ property within 30 months.

RESIDENTS OUTSIDE THE CITY LIMITS CANNOT VOTE IN CITY ELECTIONS YET ARE **SUBJECT TO CITY REGULATIONS.**

This bill DOES:



- Protects property owners from regulation without representation
- Disincentivizes cities to restrict property use in areas where residents cannot vote in city elections
- Maintains a city's authority to regulate landowners while also holding them accountable for serving ALL their constituents
- Creates equal opportunity for landowners who live outside the city limits to receive the same services and benefits as those that live inside the city limits


This bill DOES NOT:



- Does NOT prohibit a city from regulating property in its ETJ
- Does NOT force a city to deliver all city services to all areas of its ETJ
- Does NOT force a city to allow ETJ residents to vote in city elections
